Fashion is imbedded in the human experience as the wearing of clothes is an exclusively human characteristic. Historically, there has always been some disagreement among scientists on when humans began wearing clothes, but newer studies suggest it started sometime around 170,000 years ago. Importantly it allowed humans to successfully migrate out of Africa.

The sewing of clothes has been dated to at least 50,000 years ago when sewing needles were found and are likely to have been made about 10,000 years before the arrival of Neanderthal and human groups in the cave. The oldest possible example is 60,000 years ago, a needlepoint (missing stem and eye) found in Sibudu Cave, South Africa. Other early examples of needles dating from 41,000 to 15,000 years ago are found in multiple locations, e.g. Slovenia, Russia, China, Spain, and France.

Morphed out of this historical blast from the past comes today's "Fashion on Fire!" Please join us for a joyful experience of current day fashion, embedded with history, creativity, self-expression, and personal identity.




